These were the pleas from several of our Global Ministry Partners in Asia. Typhoon Yagi left a wide path of destruction in Bangladesh, India, and Myanmar. Hundreds of people lost their lives, thousands are displaced, and millions were impacted by the severe flooding.



Humble homes were totally destroyed in Myanmar.

In addition to the devastation of the storm, the lack of support and assistance by the government is causing ongoing pain and suffering.

Instead of asking for help for themselves, our partners have been reaching out to provide whatever relief they can to so many who are suffering. Pastor Moses said *“My heart is very pain and crying. The rain has stopped but the village (Naypyitaw) became a*

garbage heap. In some villages the people are able to stay in their homes, but they have no food to eat. They will need help for at least six months to survive.”

Feed My People pastors in India have been taking truckloads of bread, rice, water, and blankets to the hardest hit areas. When they first took the truck out the water was too deep to get through. Thankfully, they found a tractor to use to deliver the supplies.

Pastor Richard, also in Myanmar, explained how the flooding crisis has caused prices to sky rocket. Before the flood, they paid about \$48 for a bag of rice. The same rice is now costing \$190! Due to the flooding, the ongoing war, and students attending the Mission Training School, there are now 125 people living at the Agape Children's Home. They are struggling to provide basic food for everyone.

Pastor Joseph (India) who had heart surgery in January, along with seven other people had to spend four days stranded on top of the roof of his home. They lost all of their belongings. Pastor Thomas was able to



give him 100 pounds of rice, five blankets, and some pots for cooking. He is so appreciative, but needs much more help.

Pastor *Samuel in Bangladesh confirmed that the worst of the flooding is in the area where they reside. They are also facing challenging situations as they struggle to provide relief to many.
